

COOKIE STATEMENT (version 01 – 28-05-2018)

1. ANALYSIS OF WEBSITE VISIT

A. Cookies

- I. Oceannet only uses functional and analytical cookies. Tracking cookies are not used in order to protect your privacy. The information in this cookie statement is made available to you within the meaning of section 11.7a of the Dutch Telecommunications Act. A cookie is a small text file that is stored in the browser of your computer, tablet or smartphone during the first visit to this website.
- II. Oceannet uses two types of cookies on its website:
 - 1) Functional cookies are cookies with a purely technical functionality. These ensure that the website works properly, for instance your preferred settings can be remembered. They also allow us to optimise our website and service through the website.
 - 2) Analytical cookies of third parties. These cookies can keep track of your surfing behaviour. These cookies are used because we rely on the analytical service provider Google Analytics.

B. Cookie notification and what if you do not like cookies

- I. During your first visit to our website we have already informed you of the presence of cookies and we asked you for consent to place these.
- II. You can deregister for cookies by changing the settings of your internet browser in such way that it no longer stores any cookies. Moreover, you can delete all information that was previously stored through your browser settings.

- IV. Oceannet shall forthwith, however in any case within a period of four weeks, react to your request.
